Headteacher's Welcome

We are excited to be able to share with you information about the Priory Witham Academy. We understand that moving to secondary school is a big step and hope that what you hear and see will help you to make a decision regarding the next step in your child's education. We have been oversubscribed as an Academy for a number of years now and I would like to share with you what makes the Witham Academy so special.

Firstly, we enjoy working with children. Our Academy motto is 'Believe Together, Achieve Together' and we take great pride when we see children working with staff and each other to develop academically and personally each day. We enjoy teaching children. We enjoy seeing them learn, develop, flourish and eventually go on to their next step whether that be University, the workplace or an apprenticeship. Because we enjoy working with children, we build positive relationships with the pupils we teach which makes this a productive and pleasant place to be.

Secondly, we know the children we teach.
