This guide will provide useful information to support your child in being a successful home learner.

### HOME LEARNING...

At The Priory Witham Academy, we believe that regular opportunities to undertake home learning can benefit our children for the following reasons:

- it consolidates the skills we have taught in class;
- it extends and enriches learning that has taken place in class;
- it allows children to explore areas of interest within a topic, encouraging independent study;
- it gives parents an insight into the learning that is taking place in class;
- it encourages partnerships between parents and teachers;
- it improve your child's organisational and study skills.

### HOME LEARNING ROUTINES...

We know you will encourage and support your child with home learning.

Creating a routine is key to ensure your child develops a positive attitude to home learning.

- Choose a time that best suits your family and stick to it. Many parents encourage their
  children to complete home learning as soon as they get in, or straight after tea. Remember
  choose a time that suits both you and your child—don't choose a time that clashes with
  their favourite TV programme or with your teatime preparations or both you and your child
  will become frustrated and stressed.
- Home learning should consolidate learning that your child has been working on in class. We would not expect a child to spend a long time on a piece of work if they are having real difficulty with it. If this is the case, please stop your child and let their teacher know.

This is what your children think...


Use resources I've been given and think about my learning in school to help me.

Use a pencil and ruler and make sure I fold any sheets neatly.

I need a quiet space to concentrate.

I need a comfortable place to work like sitting at a table. Switch off things that might distract me, like the television.

If I'm stuck, I can ask my teacher when I am back in school.



Try your best and don't give up.

If I'm stuck I could ask my older brother or sister as they may have learnt it before.


Plan when I am going to do my home learning. This will help me to learn how to manage my time.

### CLASS HOME LEARNING...

Each week, your child will get a piece of **mathematics** and **English** home learning linked to what they have been learning about in class, which will be uploaded on to **Sharepoint**. There is guidance for accessing Sharepoint later on in this booklet.

If your child does not have access to a computer with internet access, a home learning book will be given to them.


All home learning will be **set on a Friday** and will need to be completed/ submitted by the **following Wednesday**. This gives your child a chance to organise their own workload over the week. Your child will receive feedback on their homework in a variety of ways, this will not always be written feedback.

### READING AT HOME...

All children have a reading book, which is at a level they should be able to read with a little support. We recommend that children read at least 3-5 times per week.

They need to understand what they are reading, so asking your child questions during and after will support in the development of their comprehension skills.

Quest books are used as a link between school and home, to support and monitor reading. We value comments made by parents and encourage you to either celebrate successes or raise any issues related to your child's reading skills.



### MULTIPLICATION TABLES...

By the end of Year 4, children are expected to know all their multiplication tables up to 12x12. It is therefore expected that children will practise their timestables each week.

The class teacher will direct the children on which multiplication to learn and its corresponding division calculation.

The best way for them to practise this is on 'Times Table Rock Stars' as the children are familiar with using this in school.

There is more information about this 'app' as you go through the booklet.

### TOPIC CHALLENGES...

Each term, your child will receive a list of challenges linked to their topic that can be completed at home. We ask that at least two from the list are attempted and brought into school to be celebrated.

Children are free to choose the challenges they are interested in, and this will hopefully encourage independent learning.

### TOP TIPS TO HOME LEARNING...

### Talk

Give children a chance to talk about their learning. Even if you know little about certain subjects, you can help just by talking and listening and helping them find their own answers.

### Be organised

Help your child take responsibility for organising and doing their home learning and praise them for their hard work. Set-up a home study plan, splitting the work into manageable chunks and allocating time for breaks.

### Space

Create a quiet space at home where your child can work without being disturbed. Switch the TV and other devices off so there is nothing to distract your child.

### SHAREPOINT...

Sharepoint is a platform which will allow the children to interact with the systems they use at school. Your child will have their own username and password to be able to log in to Sharepoint and we will work with your child at school to support their understanding of how to log-in, access and upload their home learning.



Please follow the guidance below to access Sharepoint:

- 1. Go to the academy website www.priorywitham.co.uk
- 2. Click on **HOME GATEWAY** in the right hand corner




3. Click on the Citrix icon (not Sharepoint at this stage)



4. Enter your child's school username and password



5. Click Desktop at the top of the page and then 'Student Desktop'

**8.** Click on **Priory Witham** logo

















8. Scroll down and click on the tab labelled Primary (on the left hand side under subjects)




**9.** When you have clicked on the link named **primary** the following screen should appear:



### SHAREPOINT - UPLOADING WORK...

Once children have completed their home learning, they will upload on to Sharepoint for the teacher to look and provide feedback. Your child should save their work in their name e.g. Joe Bloggs Maths. To upload, please click on the **upload** link and click on files. Please select the document with the home learning and upload.



Your child's class teacher has been working with them at school to support their understanding of how to log-in, access and upload their home learning. If they have any difficulties with this, please get in touch so we can support you and hopefully resolve any issues quickly.

### WEBSITES AND APPS...

Using websites or apps are a really good way of supporting or extending your child's learning. Below are some recommended ones you could download and use with your child:

#### **Times Table Rock Stars**

This is a carefully sequenced programme of daily times tables practice. Your child will have their own username and password to be able to log in to the app.



#### BBC Bitesize www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize

A range of videos and activities to support your child with their learning with all subjects. It is easy to use and is aimed at all primary year groups.



#### MathsWatch (for years 4-6) www.mathswatch.co.uk

Teachers will set the children questions linked to the maths learning they have been exploring in school. If children need further help, there are videos to support them. Your child's teacher will monitor your child's progress. Children will need a username and log in from their teacher.



#### Oxford Reading Owl

A free online library for your child to read a range of exciting books. Children will have a class log in from their teacher.





### HOME LEARNING DUE TO SELF ISOLATION...

If you need to learn at home over an extended period of time, you will be provided with daily learning tasks for English and Mathematics along with other learning activities. 
Activity	What this might look like
Eat breakfast together	Eat breakfast together as a family where possible. Talk about what you are going to do during the day and ask them about what they would like to do.
Morning challenges	This is what the children do when they come to school in the morning - there will be some challenges to choose from on Sharepoint; you should be able to do one of these a day.
Learning time	Your child's teacher will set lots of work for your child whilst they are absent from school, this doesn't mean it all needs completing in one day. Any activities that you have done, either school's or your own, can be shared on Sharepoint. Remember, the work should be saved in the child's name.
Make lunch	Get your child to help you make a healthy lunch. Include some of their favourites but also include something new. It is important children try a range of foods when they are young.
Activity time	We will provide you with a range of activities for being quiet, active or creative. Space out the activities with some of your own. You could even help with some of the household chores!
