An introduction to the <i>Elements of Art</i>.</p> <p>Module 2- Colour theory The colour wheel, learning how to mix colours and techniques of painting.</p> <p>Module 3-Line and Tone Pupils learn how to create different tonal effects, 3D shapes and mark making.</p> <p>Module 4-Monster Me Imaginative project, creating a 3D model out of clay. Introduction to clay tools and techniques.</p> <p>Module 5-Abstract Art Looking at the work of 'Kandinsky', pupils create their own abstract painting reinforcing their colour and painting skills.</p> <p>Module -Pop Art Studying the work of Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein.
